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FAQs

Where do I login?: Go to the library's Teen Website at <http://www.mtpl.org/?q=teen>. Click on the 100 Books Before College icon.

How do I log my books?: Log onto your account online and log the title of each book you read.

Can I write reviews of the books I read?: Yes! Select the Challenges tab on your account and you can write reviews of the books you read. Let the Teen Librarian know which books you liked and which you wouldn't recommend.

If I'm not a freshman, can I log the books I've already read while in high school ? Yes. If you are starting this program as a sophomore, junior, or senior you may type in the books you already read in your freshman, sophomore, or junior years. However, you may only count the books you read while in high school.

Do you have any reading suggestions? Yes! The Teen Librarian has made a list of 100 books to read before college. You do not have to read the books on the list, but you might want to challenge yourself to read some of them. The list is online and in the Teen Room.
